

### The MIT President: Role

- The President serves as the CEO of MIT, and as a member of the MIT Corporation and Chair of its Executive Committee
- The President presides as senior officer of the faculty at meetings of that body, and chairs several management councils, including the Academic Council and the Administrative Council
- The President is personally involved in building and sustaining relations with the federal government, as well as with industry, alumni and alumnae, and other individual and institutional supporters





# Student Advisory Group to the Corporation Committee on the Presidency

- Chaired by **R. Erich Caulfield** (GSC President) and **Pius Uzamere II** (UA President)
- Charge:
  - To provide the Corporation with a representative student perspective on the challenges facing MIT in this decade
  - To comment on the experience and personal qualities that should be found in the next President
  - To provide nominations of specific individuals for the MIT Presidency
  - To provide additional input throughout the developing process until the next President is selected
- Final Selection will be made by the MIT Corporation Committee on the Presidency

### What qualities would you most seek in the next MIT President?

- importance of activism and leadership by the MIT president on a national / global level vs. managing MIT's internal affairs
- level of direct involvement by the president in affairs of the Institute (as opposed to a more managerial role)

- Fundraising
- building MIT's physical infrastructure
- improving student life programs
- national-level activism for student concerns
