Fed seen on hold with "extended period" wording intact

The Federal Reserve will repeat its pledge that interest rates can remain at historic lows "for an

extended period" following its meeting Tuesday, analysts said.

But the oft-repeated language of the policy statement -- closely followed in financial circles -- isn't necessarily expected to remain in place for much longer. Continued positive economic data may serve as the catalyst for Fed officials to end the "extended period" pledge in April, Fed watchers said.

Safety cushion: In a contingent immunization strategy, the difference between the initially available immunization level and the safety-net return.
