- Dr. Clayton Forrester (Charles Hope): The Mayor of Sciencetown. His term expires today, and hopefully today's election will be less controversial than the one in which he was elected. Dr. Strangelove had been leading in preliminary polls, whereupon Forrester launched all of his supporters into space (specifically, to the Satellite of Love). The vote was a landslide.
- Dr. Horrible (Ben Kaduk): The Official Blogger of Sciencetown. He is the major news source of the town, writing and singing about whatever strikes his fancy, and (for some reason or another) he has quite a bit of sway over popular opinion.

- Dr. Mario (Catherine Olsson): A doctor of biology specializing in viral pharmacology. He arrived in Sciencetown about a week ago, fleeing the spreading drone epidemic. Seems to have an unhealthy attachment to a woman named "Peach".
- Jekyll (Alex Kandell): A doctor of chemistry with some violent mood swings. He was extradited to Sciencetown by the British government several years back after one of his rages destroyed the Tower of London, and has subsequently claimed to have cured the condition that was causing the problems.
- Dexter (Nikolas Koutsopoulos): A young (and rather diminutive) man of German descent who showed up about a year ago after his sister destroyed his lab for the Nth time. He seems to be interested in acoustics.
- Dr. Doom (JB Parkes): The sovereign ruler and absolute dictator of Latveria, an Eastern European nation. . . up until a week ago when Latveria ceased to exist thanks to the drone epidemic. Since his arrival here he has developed signs of multiple personality disorder stemming from the loss of his homeland.
- Dr. Evil (Shawn Westerdale): The archnemesis of Austin Powers, he was sent to Sciencetown five years ago after his last scheme involving lasers backfired so badly that the British government was forced to take action. He has since turned inwards and focused more of his time and energy towards his cat, Mr. Bigglesworth.
- Blofeld (Daniel Grazian): The head of the now-defunct criminal organization SPECTRE, he is an arrogant genius who was exiled to Sciencetown by MI6 years ago. Ever since, he has become even more twisted and cold, and focuses on getting revenge on James Bond almost to the point of obsession.
- Egon Spengler (Mike Salvato): A former Ghostbuster from New York City, he arrived in Sciencetown a couple of years ago. Over the years, he became even more withdrawn and introverted than he had been in his Ghostbusting days, to the point where nowadays he is a walking bag of neuroses. Dr. Hannibal Lecter has been working with him for a while now, and thinks he is close to a breakthrough.
- Dr. Frankenstein (Paul Kominers): A doctor of medicine who has pioneered numerous advances in lightning-based revivification. Claims to have caused the drone epidemic as a prelude to taking over the world.
- Dr. Claw (Daniel Kane): Leader of the now-defunct MAD crime syndicate, and archnemesis of Inspector Gadget. It is said that no one has seen his face and lived to tell the tale, though it's unclear who would be telling those tales.
- Luthor (Samantha Powers): A cutthroat businessman and scientist, Luthor served as head of LexCorp in Metropolis. He arrived here several days ago when fleeing from the drone epidemic, and promptly paid Dr. Clayton Forrester one billion dollars for one quarter of Sciencetown (since renamed Luthorville).
- Bill Nye the Science Guy (Alexandra Westbrook): A longtime resident of Sciencetown who's been living in town since his show went off the air years ago. A great educator and musician.

- Dr. T (Greg Lohman): A large black man, formerly of the A-Team TV series. He left his acting career to enroll in a PhD program and received a Doctorate in Science, and since then has been living in Sciencetown and pitying fools.

The Sciencetown Code
